Here, you can read about the amazing ways in which your kind donations are being used by the Church of South India.

The Climate Resilient Schools programme

In South India there are many environmental problems caused by heavy pollution and the effects of climate change.

The Church of South India empowers the next generation through their educational services, from nursery to secondary school, across five states of India.

The programmes centre children in the life of the church,

raising awareness of the rights of women and girls and teach children about the importance of protecting the environment. They focus on addressing the issues the students face on a daily basis whilst benefitting them educationally.

With the guidance of teachers, students will audit the consumption of natural resources within school campuses and help their schools to become good environmental managers by adopting greener solutions.

The audits will focus on air, energy, food, land, water and waste. As well as being invaluable in themselves and good for fostering teamwork and collaboration, it also means students will benefit across different academic areas.

For example:

- Measuring of garbage collected (Maths)
- Composting methods (Biology)
- Waste mantSocial Studies)
- Narrative reports (English)
- Online report submission (IT studies)

Schools will submit reports, which are then graded and certified, based on their performance, and be able to take steps to improve their environmental approach. Students can then report back on the changes that have been made.

Kurnool Nandyal Girls Skills Training Project

The Church of South India launched the Kurnool Training Centre for Young Women with the aim of equipping young women with vital skills with which they can improve their quality of life.

The centre is based in the city of Kurnool in Andhra Pradesh. Young women and girls from surrounding rural areas come here to learn skills such as:

- Sewing
- English
- IT
- Basket making

Along with these practical skills, women at the centre also take classes in church history and bible knowledge, with an emphasis on the importance of women in the bible.

By the time they finish the course, many women with no previous computer skills can confidently use Adobe Photoshop, Microsoft Office and Tally (an accounting software package that is widely used in India) or send emails and surf the internet. Others can confidently translate from their first language into English.

Women who have attended courses at the centre testify that the training they have received boosted their self-confidence and has enabled them to be financially independent and support their families. Many of them feel that society respects them a little more than before now that they have acquired some skills and can take care of themselves.

Some women have secured full time jobs; others have started successful businesses. Some have also become more actively involved in their local churches, usually by teaching at Sunday school or helping to run women's groups, thanks to the bible studies they attended at the training centre.
